"My recollection of the first induction is one of the most memorable of my professional career. It was a truly remarkable parade of laureates including Dr. Banting. A scene that I shall never forget was Bill Banting, shy and soft-spoken, relaying to the audience the story of sharing an afternoon with his father in a London park when he was asked if he could keep a secret. His father shared that later that evening he would be flying overseas on a confidential mission. It was the last time he saw him as the ill-fated flight ended tragically when it crashed in Newfoundland. As Bill provided this deeply personal account of a sacred time, a hush fell over the entire audience. We were all profoundly moved and from that moment on The Canadian Medical Hall of Fame was forever established."

The Canadian men and women inducted into the Hall of Fame have made significant contributions to medicine and their work has saved literally countless lives throughout the world.

Executive Director Nancy Poole said the hall talks about our medical heritage so "it is very appropriate that the Canadian Medical Hall of Fame should be located in our museum".

The Canadian Medical Hall of Fame will be open to the public in its new location beginning January 31, 1996.





CMA wins fame with donation

The CMA is showing its support behind the Canadian Medical Hall of Fame in an effort to raise Canadians' awareness of the accomplishments of their physicians. "The CMA is delighted to do this," said Dr. Hugh Scully, the president. "Our collaboration and funding commitment recognize the importance of the hall's mission to celebrate discovery and innovation in medical science in Canada." The CMA will provide \$150,000 a year for five years to fund educational and promotional programs. The Canadian Medical Hall of Fame was founded in 1993 to recognize remarkable accomplishments by Canadians. The laureates include Sir William Osler, Frederick Banting, Michael Smith and Roberta Bondar. Six new inductees were announced last month (see sidebar). "The Hall of Fame has grown in stature and respect over the past four years," said Ted Eadinger, chair of the hall's Board of Directors. "With the support and generosity of the CMA, we can continue to grow and reach out to our country's new researchers and doctors." The hall is located in the London Regional Art and Historical Museums, 421 Ridout St. N., London, Ont. Visitors are welcome Tuesday through Sunday and on holidays; the museum is closed Mondays.

Pursuing an education in Medicine or the Health Sciences?

The Canadian Medical Hall of Fame, in partnership with Great-West Life, London Life and Canada Life, established a fund that supports up to two scholarships each year for high school students hoping to pursue an education in health or medical sciences at a Canadian university.

The value of the scholarship is \$1,000 per year toward a four-year undergraduate degree in the health sciences at any accredited Canadian university.

The scholarship is administered by the Association of Canadian Medical Colleges (ACMC), and the selection of scholarship winners is made by a committee of university representatives chosen by the ACMC.






