FROM OUR BOARD CHAIR AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

While there is still a long way to go to truly achieve equity and inclusion in the world, it is heart warming to see these values at the forefront so often lately.

At the CMHF we know that diversity in all its forms makes things better: diversity of thought sparks creativity and innovation; different viewpoints often informed by different life journeys challenge the status quo and lead to novel solutions and breakthrough ideas - at the bench and at the bedside.

The words came easily – but it's action that matters. As an organization that honours excellence typically as a lifetime achievement, we have some catching up to do. The outstanding achievements of our Laureates is undeniable; however, it must be acknowledged that the lack of diversity among CMHF Laureates reflects what leadership in health used to look like, more than what is emerging. We are working on this.

Last year we struck a task group to put into words how the CMHF values diversity - you can read this on the next page, on our website and on all our program pages. Our call for nominations includes a strong emphasis on equity and inclusion and we are slowly seeing results: the number of nominations for women has increased from 16% to 37%, now making up 55% of the nominee pool. More recent inductions include leadership in midwifery, nursing and public health, as well as our first Black and Indigenous Laureates. Indigenous participation in our Discovery Days has doubled and we have implemented more diversity tracking in our youth programs to inform our future activities.

We have more work to do, and we are committed to doing it. We are appreciative of the support received from so many partners as we strive to be an organization that reflects the diversity of the communities we serve.

We recognize that diversity, equity and inclusion strengthen the health sciences, health systems and health care communities and leads to enhanced quality, social relevance and impact of health-related disciplines.

Throughout all of its activities the Canadian Medical Hall of Fame strives to engage and promote the active participation of individuals of diverse backgrounds, including those from historically underrepresented groups. We actively seek a diverse pool of award nominations so that those honoured may reflect the diversity of our communities.

The Canadian Medical Hall of Fame relies on the community to nominate candidates for induction. Annually, the CMHF Laureate Selection Committee - appointed by the board but operating at arm's length from the board - reviews all nominations received. Inductees are selected from the pool of nominees that includes those nominated this year and the previous two years. Unfortunately, the current nomination pool is not as diverse as it should be, nor is it reflective of current health leadership in Canada. Please help us increase the diversity of CMHF Laureates through more nominations of individuals who identify as female or non-binary, and/or who are Black, Indigenous or People of Colour.



Thank you for responding to our call for diversity, 63% of all new nominations received in 2023 were for women or Black, Indigenous or People of Colour nominees.




